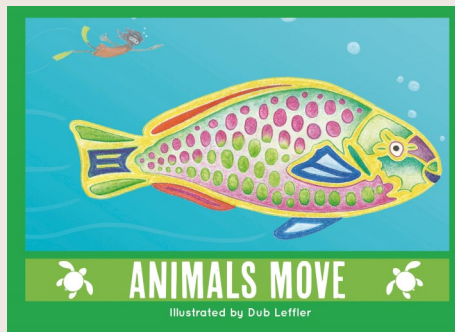

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Animals Move

This is a short, quick to read book with beautiful clear pictures. It is a great book to read with children who can only concentrate for a short time, or you can add your own story and fun to make it longer. It might also be just the right level for older siblings to read to younger children.



BEFORE READING...



- ▶ Point to the title and read "Animals Move."
- ▶ Talk about all the different ways animals move.
- ▶ Smaller format books like this one are often easier for young children to hold. Invite your child to hold the book for you while you read.

WHILE READING...



- ▶ Each page repeats the same phrase. Point to each word as you read along.
- ▶ Use your hands to show how the animals move.
- ▶ Use the pictures to help create a bigger story, e.g. where is the crab crawling to, will the pelican find other birds as it flies away?

AFTER READING...



- ▶ Look out for other animals and act out how they move with your child. See which animals you can move like; maybe it's crawling sideways like a crab, flapping your arms to fly like a bird or sniffing around like a dog.
- ▶ Follow the same pattern as the book and describe what animals are doing. "The dog is running." "The cat is sleeping."

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
