

Book Tip Sheet

Baby Touch: Night-Night Ladybird

Join us saying good night to the garden, vehicles and animals in the story. You and your child can enjoy touching, reading and recognising the characters on each page.



BEFORE READING...



- Find a comfortable place to share the story, make sure you have a quiet space and time to explore the book. This is a great book to read before nap time or bedtime at the end of the day.
- Let your child touch and hold the book to become familiar with the feel of it. Let them practice turning the pages, helping them as needed.

WHILE READING...

▶ Look at the pictures on each page and name the animals or vehicles. Pause and see if your child will repeat the names.



Ask if your child can find a particular picture on the page, pause and see if your child points to the image. You could ask "where is the frog?" or "can you see the car?". There's also a red ladybird hiding on each page.

AFTER READING...



- ▶ Re-read the story, try to make the sounds of the animals or vehicles, does your child copy the sounds?
- ▶ Point to and touch the star in the centre of the book, ask your child who is in the centre of the star?
- ► Having a routine of reading before bed can help your child settle down to sleep.
