


Dolly Parton's IMAGINATION LIBRARY Book Tip Sheet



The Complete Guide to a Dog's Best Friend

A hilarious story to share with your children about how dogs see the world and the funny ways they think they are helping their human best friends.



BEFORE READING...

- Find a quiet space to read together and look at the cover.
- Ask your child to help you count how many dogs they can see on the cover.



▶ Does your child know anyone who has a dog? Encourage them to describe the dog using adjectives: are they big or small? What colour are they? Are they cheeky? Noisy? Clever?

WHILE READING...

Laugh along with your child at the funny things the dogs do in the story.



- ▶ Look at the illustrations on each page. Ask your child how they might feel if a dog did any of these things? Would they think the dog was being helpful?
- ► Talk about what the dog might be thinking or feeling. Do they think this is how they help their humans?

AFTER READING...



- ► Review the pages and talk about some of the funny things dogs do. Which was your child's favourite page? What "helpful" thing was the funniest?
- ► Look at the last page; how does a dog show how much they love their best friend? How is this different from how humans show love?
