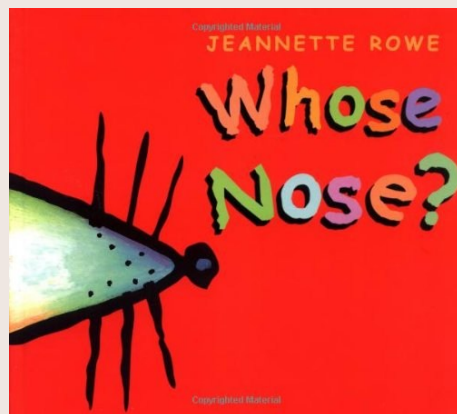
Book Tip Sheet proudly
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Whose Nose?

This colourful and lively lift-the-flap book will bring you and your child into a game of hide and seek. A sneak peek of each animal's nose is shown and you can play a guessing and problem-solving game together to find out who the nose belongs to!



BEFORE READING...



- ▶ Move your finger under the title *Whose Nose?* from left to right while your child holds the book or you hold it in front of them.
- ▶ Lift your hands up at your side when reading "whose nose?" to show that it is a question and we need to find the answer.

WHILE READING...



- ▶ Encourage your child to lift the flap each time to see who is hiding.
- ▶ Say the /s/ sound after every animal clearly to show that we use this sound to say that something belongs to someone e.g., "pig's nose", "elephant's nose".
- ▶ Get a mirror ready for the last page and encourage your child to look in the mirror, point to their nose and label "my nose" to help them relate to the book.

AFTER READING...



- ▶ Take turns to label facial parts in the mirror. Point to your nose, ask 'whose nose?' and you could say e.g., "Nana's nose". Take turns pointing to eyes, ears, mouth, nose, hair and labelling who they belong to...you can use "my" or their name when referring to your child to give them the language they need!
- ▶ Play a game of peek-a-boo with your child when you finish the book. You could ask 'who is it?' and try getting some favourite toys involved.

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
